**Class:** Loosen Up With Florals

### Materials List:

Tube or pallet paints are your choice, but for very loose blends, tubes are better. For the paints, essentials are a red, blue, and a yellow, a green, and Payne's Gray (optional). Go ahead and bring a few other colors that make you excited that you would like to see in your florals.

If using tubes which I suggest above, you will need an empty palette to squeeze a dab into.

- 140 lb cold press watercolour paper, size 8x10, 9x12 or similar
- Round size 10 or 12 watercolor brush,
- Round size 6 watercolour brush,
- Size 4 or 6 rigger (sometimes called a liner)
- Very fat masking tape, 1 and 1/2 in. I prefer the Dollarama brand because it does not pull fibers from our paper.
- Spray bottle, optional.
- A couple sheets of cardboard or any kind of firm board to tape your work down.
- A Sharpie or similar permanent black marker, and a very fine tip marker, for fine doodles.
