Class: Stitched Sketchbook

Your \$5 material fee includes:

- 1 pack of DMC embroidery needles
- 1 skein of DMC embroidery floss
- Fabric scraps and use of shared materials

You will need to bring:

- Pins
- Fabric - you may decide to purchase fabric to complete your project, but for week 1, please bring in scraps to get you started. Try to bring a mix of plain and patterned fabric. Raid your closet for old clothes that could become beautiful sketchbook pages (jeans are great). Sentimental items can be incorporated into your sketchbook if you wish.
- Threads - DMC embroidery floss is the most common but try to include different thicknesses and textures if you can. Sewing machine threads can be great to embroidery with, as can yarn. Your material fee includes 1 skein of thread, so you don't need to buy any threads for week 1.
- Notebook or sketchbook and pencil.
- Embroidery hoops are optional. Thicker fabrics like denim don't need them and some stitchers prefer to work without one.

If you have the following, please bring along (if you do not have these items, you can use shared materials supplied by instructor):

- A needlecase with large and small needles. Darning needles are great for thicker threads.
- Scissors
- Different pencils / gel pens / colouring pencils (and pencil sharpener) for marking fabric.
- If you have your own sewing machine ***and are confident using it***, you may bring it to week 4 to piece your sketchbook together. The instructor will only demonstrate hand sewing techniques, but if you love machine sewing, you may want your stitched sketchbook to reflect that. Everyone's sketchbook will be unique.
